Aug. 24	at Boise*	L	24-38

Tanner Gustavsen threw for 212 yards and three touchdowns as Boise started the season with a big SIC victory, celebrating the opening of Dona Larsen Park. The Lions got off to a slow start, but QB Cole Skinner passed for 318 yards and three scores. He led a fourth-quarter rally. Kion Williams caught eight passes for 247 yards. Hunter Kenyon was the top runner with 92 yards.

Cole Skinner passed for 231 yards and four touchdowns and Hunter Kenyon had a good game running the ball as Borah earned its first win by beating Centennial. The Lions trailed 21-14 early in the third quarter before rallying to regain the lead, and the confidence they needed this season. Skinner connected with Kion Williams and Justin Coburn. Kenyon had 107 rushing yards and the defense held on.

Hunter Kenyon rushed for a career-high 219 yards and scored four touchdowns as Borah rallied from a huge deficit and edged Meridian in an SIC game. This was two different games, and Borah dominated the final half. The Lions trailed 28-6 at halftime, but just kept handing the ball to Kenyon while the defense stopped the Warriors. Emilio Trevino made a big play that gave Borah the ball with three minutes left.

Sept. 14	MOUNTAIN VIEW*	W	35-21

Cole Skinner threw four touchdown passes - two to Kion Williams - as Borah surprised Mountain View in a 5A SIC contest. The game was played on an eerie Saturday afternoon with smoke-filled skies from nearby fires. Skinner finished with 286 yards and his TD total was a season high. Hunter Kenyon was a workhorse, with 36 carries for 124 yards. This was a key game because it broke a tie in the league standings and moved the Lions right behind the leaders.

Sept. 28	TIMBERLINE*	W	31-21

Cole Skinner threw for 247 yards and three touchdowns - two to Kion Williams - as Borah rallied in the fourth quarter to down Timberline and win its homecoming game. The Lions led most of the game, but lost the momentum in the third quarter. Williams had seven catches for 152 yards, including a 22-yard scoring pass to put Borah ahead again and Hunter Kenyon put it away with a 1-yard run.

Hunter Kenyon rushed for 137 yards and Jacob Szuch kicked three field goals to lift Borah to its first win over Eagle in eight years. This ended up being one of the key wins for the Lions this season. Cole Skinner threw for 238 yards. Kion Williams had a great game with six catches for 188 yards and a touchdown. He also had an interception that clinched the win. The Lions led 13-7 at halftime but fell behind until Kenyon scored on a 4-yard run with 1:21 left.

Hunter Kenyon had a good night with 77 rushing yards and a had couple of scores. The defense had Vallivue silenced until late in the game.

Tarik Littlejohn scored two touchdowns and Borah's two-point conversion pass late in the game was ruled incomplete and that allowed Capital to hang on to beat its rival in a 5A SIC game. QB Cole Skinner passed for 324 yards and RB Hunter Kenyon had 172 rushing yards as the game went back-and-forth. The Lions went 73 yards in the final two minutes and Skinner found Trey Dennis for the score. Skinner then found Montana Bilger for the two-point conversion and it took a while for the decision to be made.

Karsten Niederer and Hunter Kenyon each rushed for over 100 yards and Jacob Szuch added a couple of field goals to lift Borah past Rocky Mountain in a 5A SIC contest. The Lions earned the top seed from the SIC with the win. Borah led 17-0 at halftime at Rocky's stadium, but the key play was a 20-yard touchdown throw to Kion Williams after Rocky had rallied. Skinner finished with 230 passing yards as Borah had a balanced offense.

Michael Beseris rushed for 153 yards and Neil Jewell had 89 more, including a 69-yarder on a key third-down play late in the game to lift Highland past Borah in a 5A playoff game. Skinner threw for a season-high 428 yards and two touchdowns and PK Jacob Szuch kicked four field goals. Borah led 20-14 at halftime, but had to deal with injuries to Hunter Kenyon and Karsten Niederer in this game and that made a difference at the end.
