

# Sophs finish on a high note

Team turned it around after Alta and ends with four straight wins

The Brighton sophomore football teams' season can easily be characterized this season – what happened before the Alta game, and what happened after.

The Bengals finished with a 5-4 record, but came on strong at the end. They turned it around after a disappointing loss to Alta. Coach Bill McDonald said the team created a whole new entity.

“We started out with raw kids who didn’t have a lot of experience,” McDonald said. “By the end of the year, they looked like football players. They were knocking people down and getting after people.”

The loss to Alta – the Bengals’ traditional rival – motivated the team. Brighton won four straight. The offense came alive at the same time the defense started stopping teams. For many teams, 5-4 would be considered only “so so.” This squad celebrated that fact.

“At first, the kids really didn’t understand all it took to play this game,” McDonald said. “After the Alta game, it was amazing to see the transformation.”

There is a lot of talent in the sophomore/freshmen class,” he added. “It wasn’t all together because we had so many young kids that moved up. When they get together, we’ll see what happens. There are some big possibilities there.”

The sophs were led by quarterback Jordan S. Johnson. McDonald said he made a lot of progress, and the Bengals relied on his passing a lot because there were a lot of injuries to their running backs.

The team’s top receivers were freshmen Simi Fehoko and Kaden Garden. McDonald said Garden provided one of the team’s best memories when he blocked a Jordan player from the hashmarks to the track.

“We lit a fire under him,” Williams said.
