Josh Buss rushed for 165 yards and scored two touchdowns as Mountain View started the season on a high note. The Mavericks led 26-0 at halftime and, when it seemed like Meridian was about to rally, Buss returned a kickoff 94 yards for a score. QBs Kai Turner and Garrett Collingham had touchdown throws and Turner ran for another.

QB Kai Turner threw for 181 yards and Garrett Collingham came in for one play and tossed a TD pass.

QB Kai Turner threw three touchdown passes, but the defense couldn't stop the Lions.

Buss took over in the second half to end Boise's threat.

Kai Turner passed for three touchdowns and ran for another as Mountain View built a 44-6 halftime lead and buried Centennial. After the Patriots took a 7-3 lead in the first quarter, the Mavericks dominated. Turner passed for 221 yards with no interceptions. Josh Buss carried 24 times for 156 yards and Connor Armstrong had eight receptions.

Oct. 19	EAGLE*	W	48-22

Josh Buss set a school record with 244 rushing yards, and he also scored four times as Mountain View kept its slim postseason hopes alive with a win over Eagle. The Mavs played another complete game, and let Buss show his skills. MV led 28-10 at halftime and kept pouring it on. MV had 350 rushing yards and didn't have any turnovers.

Oct. 26	at Vallivue*	W	47-20

Kai Turner passed for 214 yards and four touchdowns, and Josh Buss crossed the end zone three times as Mountain View whipped Vallivue in the season finale. The Mavericks had a balanced offensive scoring attack and grabbed a big lead early. They finished the season with a 6-3 record, but narrowly missed going to the 5A playoffs. Buss rushed for 67 yards as Mountain View averaged 8.5 yards per carry.
