The Jazz won the game, 99-91, behind 18 points from guard Mo Williams.

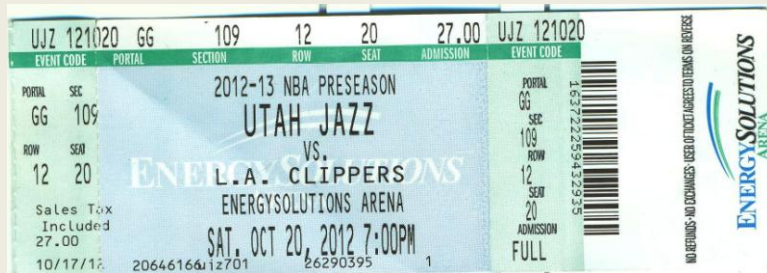
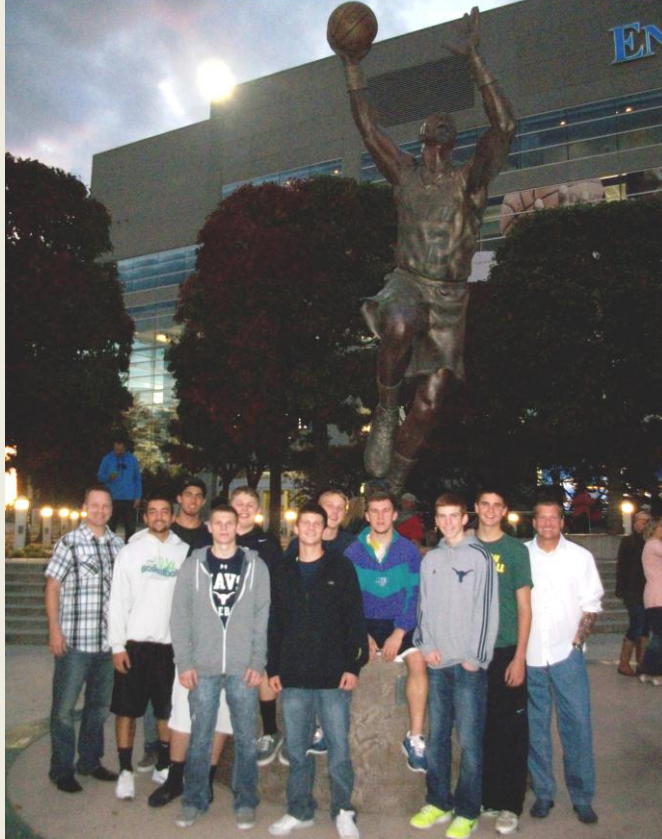


**ABOVE:** Al Jefferson was the Utah Jazz's leading scorer this season.

## Jan. 25 – Mountain View 46, Boise 44

**Story of the game:** Kody Olson tipped in Tanner Percifield's shot with three seconds remaining to help Mountain View get past Boise in a 5A SIC game.

**Mountain View's highlights:** The game was close throughout with MV usually holding a small lead. Percifield topped the Mavs with 12 points and Olson had one of his best outings with 10 points and seven rebounds. Olson also took two charges in the fourth quarter.

**Boise's highlights:** The Braves rallied in the third quarter to take the lead. Sam Simpson scored 13 points and he had some help from Alex Rant, Ben Showalter and Brian Smith. Boise was the more aggressive team, especially in the second half. The Braves had a decent look at a three-pointer at the buzzer, but missed.

**Statistical notes:** MV shot just five free throws – and made two. Percifield, normally good from the line, missed his only attempt. Boise outrebounded the Mavs 35-29 with Simpson pulling down nine. MV made six three-pointers and that made a difference.

**What we learned from this game:** Boise is tough in its own gym and the Braves were poised to pull off the upset. Mountain View escaped and earned its third straight victory.

**Coach Nettleton's comments:** "Man, tough place to play, as usual. We shot the ball okay; we just fouled too much. In the third quarter, they outplayed us. Fourth quarter was back and forth. Kody's two charges ... they don't show on the stat sheet, but they were huge."
