Rams hold on to beat Mavs for third place

With their championship hopes doused the night before, the Mountain View Mavericks and Highland Rams met Saturday afternoon at Columbia High School with one purpose.

Who could comeback the quickest.

In the end, it was Highland, but not much separated the teams in the Rams' 59-49 victory.

"They were huge," said Mavericks' coach Jon Nettleton. "We didn't shoot too many inside shots. The boys went down guns blazing."

Tanner Percifield ended his career with 24 points and Marcus Slocum added 17. They provided most of the offense and impressed even the Rams' fans. However, Highland got 19 points from Austin Andreasen and 14 from Stefan Gonzalez.

And, in the final moments, 6-foot-6 center Clark Wilkinson got several clutch rebounds and even hit a few driving layups to put the game away.

"After we lost last night he (Wilkinson) talked to the kids and said 'hey, let's go out and win this game,'" said Highland coach Chris Frost. "Down the stretch today he decided it was going to be his game."

Percifield got Mountain View going early from the three-point line. He and Slocum drained treys at key moments. The two teams finished the first half tied.

"We knew about Percifield. He's a player. We didn't know about (Slocum)," said Frost. "He went off when we had a little bit of a mismatch with Clark on him. Any time we went to a gimmick we kind of got toasted with a three. Those are two great players. They should go on to play somewhere."

Highland used a strong third quarter, outscoring Mountain View 18-8, and rode that
