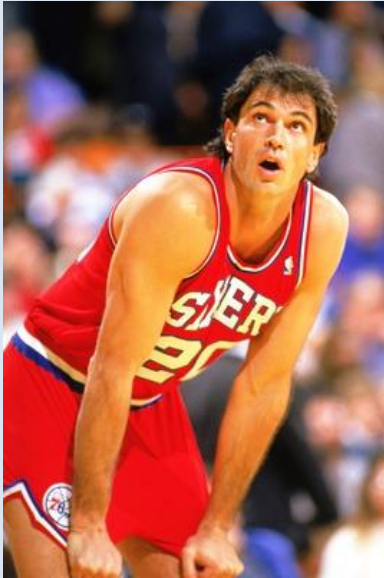

# History makers

## Danny Vranes



**VRANES WAS AN IMPACT PLAYER** for Skyline, even as a freshman.

He helped the Eagles win their first and second state championships and earned a scholarship to the University of Utah, where he became one of their top players in history, too.

Vranes was the fifth pick in the 1981 NBA draft by the Seattle Super-Sonics, and later played for the Philadelphia 76ers.

Vranes and his wife, Angie, live in the Salt Lake area and – in 2009 – he became the first Eagle basketball player to have his number retired.

## Jaron Boone



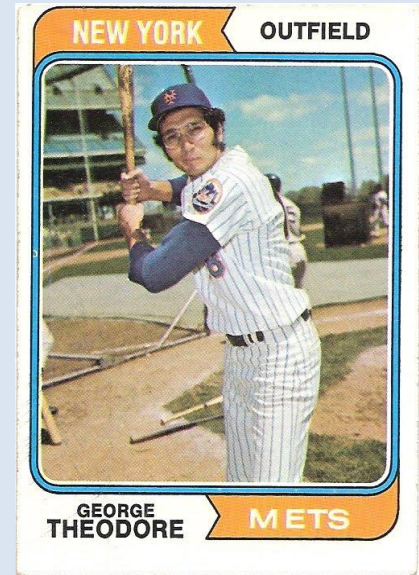
**BOONE WAS A SCORER** in his four years at Skyline (1988-92) and helped his team to a region title as a sophomore.

He had such a remarkable senior season that the Deseret News named him its “Mr. Basketball” and he earned a scholarship to Nebraska, where he almost immediately became an impact player there.

Boone is the son of Utah Jazz broadcaster Ron Boone and was a basketball prodigy beginning at a young age.

He currently lives in the Salt Lake area.

## George Theodore



**THEODORE MADE HIS NAME** on the Skyline basketball team for his rebounding prowess. He still holds the school record for most rebounds in a game. Afterward, he went on to become a professional baseball player.

He graduated from Skyline in 1965 and went on to the University of Utah. He reached the major leagues in 1973 and played two seasons for the New York Mets.

The 6-foot-4 Theodore was given the nickname, “The Stork” and became a colorful character in his day. His whereabouts are unknown.
