

Dec. 11 – Weber 45, Brighton 27

Story of the game: Erin Reichle scored 22 points as Weber dominated the second half and rolled to a non-region win over Brighton.

Weber’s highlights: The Warriors trailed 19-17 at halftime, but the game changed suddenly after that. Hannah Charlton contributed nine points and Hanna Buswell had eight. Weber had a 10-point margin by the end of the third quarter and the momentum never stopped. Reichle was the team’s rebounding leader with seven. Alyssa Potter had three blocks.

Brighton’s highlights: The Bengals had a close lead for the first half. Maddy Chin topped the team with nine points and Lindsay Johnson had seven. Brighton, however, was outscored 28-8 in the second half and it resulted in its lowest point total of the season.

Statistical notes: This was Weber’s most-convincing effort since the opener vs. Hunter. Weber shot over 45 percent from the field, but free throws again proved to be an issue for a couple of players. Afterward, Reichle was tabbed Weber’s player of the game.

What we learned from this game: Weber improved to 2-0 on the road and beat a usually capable opponent. Weber improved to 3-0 against 5A opponents.

Dec. 14 – Bountiful 69, Weber 56

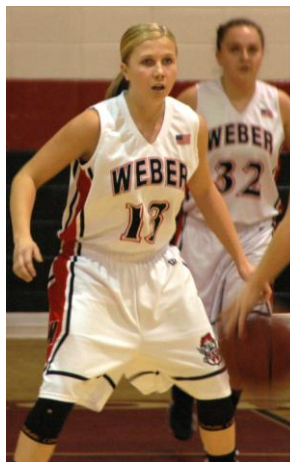
Story of the game: Ashley Eyring scored 23 points as Bountiful bolted to a quick lead and held off Weber, despite a career-best performance by the Warriors’ Hannah Charlton.

Weber’s highlights: The Warriors couldn’t keep up early, but rallied to pull within eight points. Charlton had 23 points and made 5-7 three-point shots. Erin Reichle had 18 points. Weber was forced to foul late, but still couldn’t make up the difference.

Bountiful’s highlights: The Braves shot over 50 percent from the field and also dominated the rebounding statistics. Eyring got help from Kennedy Merrick (17 points and Tiana Dougher (12 points, 13 rebounds). This was the Braves’ best win so far this year.

Statistical notes: Weber made 8-15 three-pointers, helped by Charlton’s effort, which earned her the team’s player of the game award. Bountiful shot 7-16 from the free-throw line in the fourth quarter, which kept the Braves from pulling away further. With the exception of Reichle, Weber again showed free-throw problems.

What we learned from this game: Bountiful admitted afterward that this was the best game it had played so far all year. Despite the loss, it was good to see Charlton give Weber a second scoring threat, which likely caused future opponents to take notice.
