

Nov. 20 – Weber 71, Hunter 28

Story of the game: Erin Reichle scored 29 points and Weber grabbed a big lead early en route to a convincing non-region victory over Hunter in the season opener for both teams.

Weber’s highlights: Reichle got the season off to a good start with her career-best scoring output. The Warriors led 21-4 after one quarter and it was 38-10 by halftime. Twelve different players got into the game and 11 scored.

Hunter’s highlights: There weren’t many. Desiree Benally led with 11 points and Tess Matagi had 10. The Wolverines shot well (75 percent) from the free-throw line and almost doubled their scoring total with 13 points in the final quarter.

Statistical notes: Weber’s 71 points was its season high. This was Hunter’s second-worst loss of the year. Reichle was credited with eight assists and eight steals. As a team, Weber had 21 steals. Afterward, Reichle was selected Weber’s player of the game.

What we learned from this game: Coming off a trip to the 5A championship game, Weber started the season well and dominated. While Reichle dominated offensively, Weber’s defense stood out even more.

Weber’s highlights: The game was close throughout. The Warriors trailed by two points entering the final period. Maren Ulrich had nine points and Megan Bedwell eight. Led by Reichle’s 9-of-10 effort, Weber made its free throws down the stretch.

Herriman’s highlights: This was the Mustangs’ opener. Herriman had balanced scoring, led by Ashlee Burge and Brittney Maynard with 11 points.

Statistical notes: This was the first-ever meeting between these teams. They both shot well from the free-throw line. The game was tied 25-25 at halftime. Afterward, Reichle was named Weber’s player of the game. After two games, Reichle was already the state’s top scorer.

What we learned from this game: This was a close contest and Weber fared well when it counted. Herriman would eventually make the 4A state tourney for the first time in its history.
