

Nov. 29 – Weber 59, Bear River 43

Story of the game: Erin Reichle scored 27 points and Kandice Jensen added a season-high 11 to lift Weber to its third straight victory, a non-region win over Bear River.

Weber’s highlights: This was a physical game, with both teams depending on their inside play. Weber took the early lead and then slowly built it. Poor free-throw shooting (9-17) didn’t end up being a factor. It was the only game all year that the Warriors didn’t make a three-pointer.

Bear River’s highlights: The Bears got 17 points from Jordan Theurer, but had a poor shooting night (25.8 percent) overall. Paige Toholt had a good game with 12 points, but was mostly responsible for the team’s 50 percent free-throw shooting.

Statistical notes: Jensen had a great game, making 5-6 free throws and made two important baskets in the fourth quarter. Theurer was credited with four steals for Bear River. Eighteen of Bear River’s 32 rebounds came on the offensive end. Reichle and Hanna Buswell combined for nine steals. Afterward, Jensen was tabbed Weber’s player of the game.

What we learned from this game: The Warriors improved to 3-0 with the nice victory. There was some pressure in the fourth quarter, but Weber handled it.

Dec. 4 – Weber 56, Ogden 37

Story of the game: Erin Reichle scored 22 points and Kandice Jensen had 11 as Weber pulled away from Ogden and defeated its county rival in a non-region game.

Weber’s highlights: The Warriors improved to 4-0 with another home victory. Weber led just 13-11 after the first quarter and increased the margin to 12 points by halftime. Reichle and Jensen shot well from the perimeter. Hanna Buswell helped Weber to a rebounding advantage.

Ogden’s highlights: Haley Lythgoe topped the Tigers in scoring with 16 points. Most of the game was played at the perimeter, but Ogden made just 2-16 three-point attempts, which limited its rally.

Statistical notes: Weber held a 43-32 rebounding advantage, and the Warriors corralled 15 on the offensive end. Reichle was credited with eight steals, but it was Buswell who was named Weber’s player of the game. Lythgoe made 2-3 three-pointers, but the rest of the team was 0-13.

What we learned from this game: The Warriors turned back every Ogden rally attempt. Weber shot 42 percent from the field and got help from several different players.
